With the arrival of fall, September can bring a surge in seasonal allergies for pets. Changing weather patterns and rising levels of late-summer weed pollen can trigger allergy symptoms, making early fall an important time to watch for signs of environmental allergies.

LATE-SUMMER TRIGGERS to look out for

Weed Pollen
Late-blooming weeds such as sagebrush can cause intense reactions.

Outdoor mold
Damp soil, decaying leaves, and high humidity promote mold spore growth.

Ragweed
Releases lightweight pollen that travels long distances

Dust Mites
Populations rise indoors as windows close and weather cools

WATCH OUT FOR THESE SYMPTOMS

Constant scratching, biting, or licking at paws, belly, and ears

Red, inflamed skin or hot spots.

Chronic or recurring ear infections

PROTECT YOUR PETS

WIPE PAWS
Clean your pet with a damp cloth or pet wipe after outdoor walks.

LIMIT OUTDOOR TIME
Keep pets inside during dry, windy days when pollen counts peak.

BATHE REGULARLY
Use a gentle, hypoallergenic or medicated shampoo to wash allergens from their fur

CLEAN THE HOME
Vacuum frequently and use air purifiers to trap indoor dust and spores

During a nose-to-tail exam, your veterinarian carefully evaluates your pet's overall health by checking:

- Temperature
- Heart rate & respiration
- Weight
- Teeth & gums
- Eyes & ears
- Skin & coat
- Joints & mobility

Frequently Asked Questions:

How often should I bring my pet in for a check up?

We recommend having your pet seen every 6 months because they age much faster than we do. Regular checkups can help detect diseases and health concerns early.

Does my pet need vaccinations even if they are an indoor pet?

Yes! Even indoor pets still need vaccinations. Germs and viruses can make their way into your home through open windows, your shoes and clothes, or even if your pet sneaks outside for a little adventure. Keeping their vaccinations up to date helps give them an extra layer of protection.

My pet looks fine. Do they still need a checkup?

Yes, your pet still needs a checkup. Animals hide pain and sickness very well and they cannot tell you if they hurt or feel sick inside. Regular exams find hidden problems early before they get worse
